DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR STEELHEART BY BRANDON SANDERSON

- 1. The novel introduces the concept of Epics, individuals with superhuman abilities who often abuse their powers for personal gain. How does Sanderson explore the idea of power and its corrupting influence? What parallels can you draw between the Epics and real-world figures or institutions?
- 2. The protagonist, David Charleston, seeks revenge against the Epic known as Steelheart for the death of his father. How does David's quest for vengeance drive the narrative forward, and how does it shape his character arc throughout the novel?
- 3. Sanderson creates a vivid and immersive world in *Steelheart*, complete with its own rules and mythology. What aspects of the world-building did you find most intriguing or unique, and how do they contribute to the overall atmosphere of the story?
- 4. The Reckoners, a group of rebels dedicated to overthrowing Epics, play a central role in the novel. How does David's involvement with the Reckoners challenge his beliefs and convictions? What ethical dilemmas do the Reckoners face in their fight against the Epics?
- 5. Sanderson incorporates elements of mystery and suspense into the narrative, particularly regarding the nature of Steelheart's weaknesses. How does the mystery surrounding Steelheart's powers drive the plot, and how do the characters navigate the risks and uncertainties of their mission?
- 6. The novel explores themes of hope, resilience, and the power of ordinary individuals to effect change in the face of overwhelming odds. How do David and the other characters embody these themes, and what lessons can be drawn from their experiences?
- 7. Sanderson infuses the story with humor and wit, even in the midst of action-packed scenes and highstakes situations. How does humor serve as a tool for character development and world-building in *Steelheart*?
- 8. The climax of the novel brings several plot threads to a head, culminating in a dramatic showdown between the Reckoners and Steelheart. How does Sanderson build tension and suspense leading up to this moment, and were you satisfied with the resolution?
- 9. Reflecting on the themes of power and responsibility, how do the events of *Steelheart* challenge your perceptions of heroism and villainy? What messages or insights do you take away from the novel?
- 10. How does *Steelheart* compare to other works of science fiction or superhero fiction you have read? What sets it apart, and what aspects of the novel did you find most memorable or thought-provoking?
