## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR THE FOUR WINDS BY KRISTIN HANNAH

1. How does Elsa evolve throughout the novel? What does she learn about herself, motherhood, and courage? How do her experiences shape her from the timid young woman in Texas to the resilient woman in California?
2. Elsa initially struggles with low self-esteem. How does she demonstrate bravery despite this? What moments highlight her growth in self-worth?
3. How does motherhood change Elsa? What different examples of motherhood (Elsa, Rose, etc.) are presented, and what do they convey about the challenges and strengths of being a mother during this time?
4. Do you think Elsa made the "right" choices at different points in her life, especially regarding her marriage to Rafe and her decision to leave Texas? What might have happened if she had chosen differently?
5. Describe the complicated relationship between Elsa and her eldest daughter, Loreda. How does their dynamic shift over time, and what contributes to Loreda's eventual understanding of her mother?
6. "Hope is a coin I carry." Discuss the significance of hope in the face of immense hardship throughout the novel. How does it manifest for different characters, and what keeps them going?
7. How is the American Dream defined and redefined by the characters in *The Four Winds*? How do their aspirations change as they face the harsh realities of the Dust Bowl and migrant life?
8. The novel deeply explores the bond between people and the land. Why do some families stay on their parched farms, while others head West? What does "owning land" represent to different characters?
9. The experiences of the "Okies" in California are a central part of the story. How does the novel portray the discrimination and prejudice they faced? What parallels can be drawn to the treatment of immigrants and migrants today?
10. Kristin Hannah wrote this book during the COVID-19 pandemic. What parallels can you draw between the struggles of the Great Depression/Dust Bowl era and modern times, especially regarding economic hardship, societal division, and community resilience?

11. The novel touches on the rise of communism and labor organizing in California. What drew the migrant workers to these movements? What are the risks and perceived benefits of aligning with such groups in that era?
12. What are your thoughts on Rafe's decision to leave? Do you feel sympathy for him, or do you view him as selfish? How does his departure impact Elsa and her children?
13. How do Loreda and Ant, Elsa's children, embody different aspects of their parents and the changing generations? How do you envision their futures?
14. The novel highlights the importance of female relationships, such as those between Elsa and Rose, and later with other women in the migrant camps. How do these bonds provide strength and support?
15. How do the actions of various characters, particularly Elsa and Loreda, exemplify this statement?
16. Did you find the ending of Elsa's journey satisfying? Why or why not?
17. What lasting impressions or lessons did *The Four Winds* leave you with?
